Dear Friends,

I had a blast last Sunday at the Couples Workshop we hosted at Reservoir. Twentythree couples gathered together to talk about their relationships. Here's why I wanted to run an event like this:

As a feminist living in a post-feminist movement world, I've seen and heard many challenges about marriage. I don't mean that it's just hard for women. I think it's hard for men too. For all of us, to maneuver through growing up with toxic masculinity influences and traditional roles and expectations that run in our blood

and still much of it in the social systems–it's challenging. What are the rules of engagement? No one knows! Add in two working parents with kids with no village and sometimes it feels impossible. I wanted our church to host a couples workshop that was beyond "Men, love your wife. Women, submit to your husband", where queer couples can come and feel welcome and safe, to offer to our community both the source of love and power of the gospel of Jesus for their marriage and practical science-based understanding of how we relate as human beings. Needless to say, 3 hours wasn't enough.

We didn't fix everyone's relationships but it was good for us to be together. We heard stories of journeying through faith/doubt seasons together, mental health regression of a partner, deep grief and loss. We heard from <u>Dr. Megan DeFranza</u>, about understanding our brains and the nervous system can help us have compassion in conflict. She said, "One of the best things we can do for our relationships is to learn to regulate our own distress." Oh baby, that can take us far!

If you're not in a relationship right now, "learn to regulate your own distress" now. And getting married obviously is not the end all be all. If that's a source of grief, bless you. If that feels like a thriving life, bless you! God has a unique plan for each of us. If your marriage is struggling, find community, open up about it, seek help as you go through the journey. Let's show up for each other and be with each other no matter what season we might be going through. Because, our church, we've got folks going through a difficult divorce, folks who are single and older, folks who are celebrating their engagements, and everything in between. Let us be a community that rejoices with those who rejoice and mourn with those who mourn. That no matter where we are in our life journey, it's hard to do it alone. So let's do it together and remind one another that God is with us. And even maybe, just maybe, that God even works through us to heal, to endure, to find joy, to love ourselves and our neighbors.
